

Tiffany Crouch Bartlett

While she was attending The University of Texas School of Law in the mid-1990's, Tiffany volunteered as a law clerk at Legal Aid and for the Human Rights Campaign in Austin. Following her graduation in 1996, she worked as story editor in the Hollywood film industry for nearly 7 years. But her heart never left Texas, and she returned to Austin in 2003 when she made an award-winning short film about some landmark legislation to save Texas horses from slaughter. On the recommendation of a close friend who had become a Regional Attorney for the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, Tiffany finally took the Bar exam and she began working with abused and neglected children. For over 14 years, Tiffany has been successfully representing children and parents involved in CPS cases across Central Texas in Travis, Hays, Caldwell and Williamson Counties. She has served as lead counsel in 21 parental termination jury trials and in dozens more bench trials during that time.

Since 2016, Tiffany has proudly served on the State Bar of Texas Child Abuse and Neglect Committee, as Course Director for the Child Abuse and Neglect track at the Advanced Family Law Seminar, and for the past year she has served as Chair of the Committee. Tiffany is also actively engaged as the CLE Chair on the Board of CAFA (Court Appointed Family Advocates) of Travis County in Austin. And for the past 6 years, Tiffany has enjoyed serving on panels and speaking at CLE seminars and at various CASA training programs.

Tiffany is an active litigator, and she continues to tirelessly advocate for the rights of traumatized children as well as parents who participate in services designed to alleviate the risks of abuse and neglect and who work diligently to become reunited with their children.
